



Dear Mr. Filhol:

I received your letter of September 1st just this week and take this opportunity to write to you. We have been glad to hear that there is a testimony to the gospel and true to the Reformed Faith - active in the Great Commission in France. Our times with Mr. Boyer have been refreshing. We hope we can help in some way the work to get started well there. As you mentioned, Dr. Peter Jones of your faculty is planning to come under the auspices of The Continuing Presbyterian Church. There are some things I need to ask you concerning this, after I explain something of ECOE's relationship to the Continuing Presbyterian Church.

ECOE began in January 1970 and has grown to be a useful instrument of the Lord. Wher The Continuing Presbyterian Church began to formulate in a definite way (our first General Assembly is in December) ECOE was asked to serve as the World Mission arm of The Continuing Presbyterian Church Movement. Recently we have been asked and volunteered to give over ECOE to The Continuing Presbyterian Church in December at their request. The Board of The Presbyterian Evangelistic Fellowship, that is the parent body of ECOE, has agreed to do this. So, in December ECOE will be taken in by the Committee on Mission to the World and cease to exist as ECOE by name. Many of the personnel on the Commission on ECOE will be then on Committee on Mission to the World. At that time, as Executive Director of the Presbyterian Evangelistic Fellowship I will give over my leadership to a Coordinator of their choosing. I say this in order that you will not have difficulty understanding the transfer as it takes place in correspondence.

Dr. Jones has been in the office today and we have been trying to work out arrangements with him concerning the work there. There are certain things we need to know.

- 1) I understand that the salary of Dr. Jones should come through the Seminary there so that he will be actually paid by the Seminary and ECOE would send the Seminary the amount of his salary monthly. Is this correct?
- 2) If this is correct, how much would his salary be per year in dollars?
- 3) What other benefits would you all give him and how much would this amount to in dollars? By this I mean, housing, insurance, medical and life, retirement, and any other expense that you would have in having Dr. Jones on your faculty.

September 14, 1973

If you would, outline this clearly for me. We in turn, if our arrangement is culminated, would send you monthly the amount that he would cost you. If there are certain benefits that the government would give him free of charge, let us know of this also.

Also, we need to know what would be necessary for him to come. We have heard of such things as work permit, what is this and who is responsible and who will get it? What kind of visa would be required and who would be responsible to inquire into getting it? Are there other arrangements that we need to be aware of? If you would give us an enitre picture in order that we can know what your plans are so we can fit into them.

It is our intention, if all matters devlop rightly, that we would call Dr. Jones to begin with us November 1, 1973 and if all matters go well for him to come there at the end of the year. There are certain guide lines that yet must be fulfilled, however, before these things can take place. All things are going favorable.

May God bless you in your witness to the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. It is my prayer that He will develop a seminary there faithful to the scripture, faithful to the Reformed Faith as a systemization of the scripture's teaching and very active in the Great Commission.



Enclosed you will find a copy of a letter we received from Pierre Filhol, at the Seminary in Aix-en-Province. We are sending these figures to you in a form that will facilitate comparison you need to make between the total support of which they speak and the support figure which ECOE uses for its missionaries. These are set forth in two colums as follows:

But in addition the government in France provides some family allowance and some retirement benefits.

We are corresponding with Mr. Filhol regarding just what the family allowance and retirement help the French government will provide. We also are instructing him that while you are in the U.S. we will be paying you directly. We will need from you and Rebecca an indication of how this compares in your understanding and some date at which you anticipate we should begin paying directly to the seminary than to you.

You might note also in his letter the necessity of your contacting the French Consulate in New York regarding the need for visas for you and Rebecca. We should also mention, Peter, that our guideline in sending out missionaries is that they need to have promised or in hand 75% of their support before they leave for the field. As you make your tentative plans for departure, we trust that you will be much in prayer with us for the provision of these supporting funds. In the next couple days we will be writing another letter regarding

itineration in the month of October and November. One date we might make definite at this point is that the missionary conference in Montgomery, Alabama, at the First Presbyterian Chruch, will be the weekend of November 3 and 4; they will need if at all possible to have you arrive in Montgomery on the afternoon of November 2nd, in order to begin a full 2-day schedule for their conference. In preparation for this and other conferences and contacts, please send us by return mail a photograph and biographical sketch which we may use for publicity and in turn make available to the churches.

We have indeed enjoyed the privilege of knowing you in Christ and trust that the weeks ahead will give other further opportunity for fellowship and strengthen the concern to pray for one another in the days of your service in France. Please feel free to write any questions or suggestions you may have in our developing work together.





Dear Peter:

Your letters of October 10 and 12 are very helpful to us and we will try to reply in light of the conversation that we had on the phone this week in Atlanta. There is no problem with us in paying you directly, and we are sending a copy of this letter to Pierre Filhol so that he will know of our arrangements for your salary. In a letter accompanying this one to you, we will be quoting a salary figure for the French Consulate. For those purposes we will give a total figure which will include the \$3000 estimate you give for an apartment. Our actual policy is that we pay whatever the cost of housing on the field, though we do encourage a modest apartment rather than an extravagant one.

You asked about the least expensive way to ship your things to France. Enclosed with this letter you will find a copy of a brochure from Missionary Expediters. They appear to be located only in New Orleans, and we do not know if they serve the port of Philadelphia or how the cost of having your goods trucked to New Orleans and then shipped would compare with having them shipped directly by another company from Philadelphia. We will drop a short note to them in New Orleans and ask about any advice or help they have to offer regarding shipment from your location. Perhaps some of the information regarding insurance and packing might be of help in your planning.

A phone call from Florida today, from the Rev. Dan Sulc in Fort Lauderdale, who will be handling your itineration, reminds us to ask you to make your flight reservation into Fort Lauderdale, not Miami. Please send him a schedule of your flight there. He also indicated a very difficult time in lining up churches for you to visit, even after making a presentation about your coming at a meeting of their Presbytery. Perhaps they are thinking too traditionally in terms of advanced notice and special planned meetings, or perhaps the fact that their budget for 1974 may already be planned or their benevolences already allocated enters into their consideration. Whether or not a word from Dr. Clowney to the Granada church or the Coral Ridge church would be of help, we do not know. Dan Sulc did comment that he was hesitant to contact Coral Ridge because there appears to be a decided avoidance of the Continuing Presbyterian Church on their part.

Thank you for the picture and biographical sketch; we will be preparing these to get them to the printers immediately after the meeting with the Committee for your final approval. We appreciate your willingness to go week after week in itineration and urge you to be much in prayer with us that the Lord will bring the needed support in good time. Do feel free to bring up further questions with us and to make suggestions.





Since, however, you will not be shipping much furniture, which we would cover, we will provide the cost of shipping the small amount and an additional \$600.00 for furniture to be purchased in France. One other matter we mentioned was the possibility of occasional trips to the U.S. from France, for library building purposes. We believe such trips would have to be the responsibility of the seminary itself, as for the primary evangelistic thrust to which we send you and the terms of call for all missionaries do not require or provide for such.

We are getting your picture and information to the printer for prayer cards to be made. As soon as we have them, we shall send a quantity to you. Do pray for us and know that we uphold you before the Lord in your itineration and the work to which you are going.



It sounds as though you are having a good time in your itineration, and the Lord is encouraging some response. We are aware that there will be some blank spots and we would like to mention a couple of these to you. When you leave Ken Wilson on Thursday morning, November 15th, your schedule in the North Alabama area so far is as follows: Thursday, Nov. 15, an evening service at the Ebenezer Presbyterian Church, Hobbs Island, which is in the Huntsville, Alabama area. If you can get there by public transportation on the afternoon you should call the Rev. Frank Morse. His number is 883-7298. At this point, the next thing scheduled for you is on Sunday, November 18. You are to be at First Presbyterian Church in Gadsden for the Sunday School hour, about 9:30 a.m. The pastor there is the Rev. Jim Bland.
