## SEPTEMBER TRUE-FALSE THEOLOGY GAME

Get your thinking-caps on, as this may put your knowledge of theology to the test.

## INSTRUCTIONS:

- Attached are twenty true-false statements based on Scripture, listed in order as they appear in the Bible. Feel free to mix them up or write your own.
- Decide on the movement players will use to show that a statement is true or false. Examples:
  - I Run to one side of the room if the statement is true. Run to the opposite side of the room if the statement is false.
  - If Stand up if a statement is true. Sit down if a statement is false.
  - <sup>II</sup> Thumbs up if a statement is true. Thumbs down if a statement is false.
- Have a caller read a question, giving time for players to move as decided. When everyone is in place. The caller reads the answer.
- If you want, keep score and award a prize for the most correct answers.
- Take the time after the game to read and discuss the passages given for at least the ones that were missed by players. \*

<sup>\*</sup> As an alternative to playing the game all at once, consider spreading the game out over 5-20 days, reading 1-4 statements each day and allowing time to read and discuss the passages for each.

## TWENTY THEOLOGICAL STATEMENTS ANSWERED

(in order as they are found in Scripture)

1. Birds were created on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of creation.

False, they were created on the 5th day (Genesis 1:20-23).

2. Genesis 3:15 points to Jesus.

True.

3. God told His name to Moses on Mt. Sinai.

**False**, it was in Midian when God spoke to Moses through the burning bush (Exodus 3:13-14).

4. Gideon defeated the Midianites with an army of 30,000.

**False**, God demonstrated His sovereignty by reducing Gideon's army to only 300 and defeating the Midianites (Judges 7).

5. The book of Ruth is in the New Testament.

False, it is in the Old Testament.

6. After David killed Goliath and Israel was saved from the Philistines, King Saul became jealous of David and tried to kill him.

True (1 Samuel 18:8-16).

7. The prophet Elijah was one of only two people to be taken to heaven without dying. *True*, *Enoch was the other one (2 Kings 2:1-14; Genesis 5:21-24; Hebrews 11:5).* 

8. When King Hezekiah was dying, he prayed, and God gave him 30 more years to live. *False*, *God gave him 15 more years (2 Kings 20:1-11).* 

9. There was a fourth man in the furnace with Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. *True* (*Daniel 3:19-25*).

10. In the Old Testament, there is a prophecy about Jesus's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. *True* (*Zechariah 9:9*).

11. Moses eventually stood in the Promised Land.

**True**, he and Elijah were with Jesus—seen by Peter, James, and John—at the Transfiguration (Matthew 17:3-4).

12. Jesus's triumphal entry into Jerusalem is recorded in all four Gospels.

**True** (Matthew 21:1-11, Mark 11:1-10, Luke 19:28-44, John 12:12-18).

13. There are 3 persons in the Trinity

**True**, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:19).

14. Jesus's first recorded miracle was walking on water.

**False**, it was turning water into wine (John 2:1-11).

15. The Book of Acts tells about Paul's two missionary journeys to share the good news of Jesus.

False, there were three missionary journeys shared in Acts (chapters 13-14, chapters 15-18, chapters 18-21).

- 16. "But God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." *True* (*Romans 5:8*).
- 17. The Bible says the punishment for our sins is death.

**True** (Romans 6:23).

18. After His resurrection, more than 500 people saw Jesus before He ascended to heaven. *True* (1 Corinthians 15:6).

19. There are no women listed in the "Faith Hall of Fame" found in Hebrews 11.

**False**, Sarah (Hebrews 11:11) and Rahab (Hebrews 11:30-31) and "Women received back their dead" (Hebrews 11:35).

20. In the New Jerusalem, each of the twelve gates is made of one pearl.

True (Revelation 21:21).
